Home Learning and parent partnership

Home learning is an activity (e.g reading, learning number bonds/tables) that a child is asked to complete outside of the school day, either on their own or with an adult. Research has shown that the influence of parental involvement can have a major impact on school readiness and attainment levels from birth, right up to sixteen years old.

Parents and adults in the home are essential for home learning. We encourage parents to share the home learning with their child and to decide upon the most appropriate way to complete it.

Parents can often worry that they don't have the knowledge to support their children with their home learning. If you are not sure how you can help please ask your child's teacher. However, the research shows that you make a big difference to your child's attainment just by showing an interest in their work and encouraging them. You don't need to know the answers!
