Safeguarding

West Sussex Single Point of Access

The <u>West Sussex Single Point of Access</u> (SPoA) is a dedicated service which provides a simplified single route to access specialist emotional wellbeing and mental health support. The SPoA helps direct you to the right service, eliminating the need to refer to multiple services.



SPoA accepts referrals for children and young people from the age of 4 up to a young person's 18th birthday. The young person must also be registered with a West Sussex GP. Anyone can make a referral including: children, young people, parents, carers, families, GPs and other professionals. All Autistic Spectrum Condition (ASC) and ADHD (neurodevelopmental) referrals need to continue via the current referral pathways. If there is a mental health or emotional wellbeing concern separate to this, the young person can be referred to SPoA. Referrals for young people with eating disorders, including Anorexia Nervosa and Bulimia Nervosa, need to continue directly to Sussex Family Eating Disorder Service (SFEDS).
