Attendance

At Holbrook school, we have an attendance target of 97%, which helps us provide an outstanding education to all pupils. Any child whose attendance is below 90% is considered a 'persistent absentee' by the Department of Education. Schools are required by the Local Authority to regularly review all children whose absence is below this threshold to support children and to improve their attendance. We value the home-school partnership, so please do contact us if you need support in this area.

Below is guidance as to how absence impacts upon attendance each term and over the year.

Days missed in an average school term (approx)	Day missed over a school year (approx)	Attendance Percentage
0 - 2½	0 – 7½	96% to 100% GREEN
3 - 6	8 - 19	90% to 95% AMBER
6+	20+	Below 90% RED

Please note there is no legal entitlement to holidays during term time. Holiday during term time will automatically be classed as unauthorised (unless exceptional circumstances) and a Fixed Penalty Notice may be issued. Thank you for your support in ensuring your child's attendance is the best it can be.
