

Framing Learning in the Classroom

There is no national guidance from the government as to how schools should assess and track pupil progress. It is up to each individual school to decide how to develop its own system.

Holbrook have chosen a tracking system called FLiC which stands for Framing Learning in the Classroom





Why did we choose FLiC?



- It is a system developed especially for the National Curriculum.
- \succ It has been designed by teachers for teachers.
- Teachers can easily assess children on individual objectives within the year group and then track their progress throughout the year
- The data can then be effectively analysed and used to inform where intervention, support and further challenge are needed



Children will work on the objectives for their year group, taken from the statutory National Curriculum, with the aim of meeting age related expectations by the end of the year or phase



- Teachers will make assessments against key objectives as part of the assessment process
- Teachers will track progress towards expected outcomes, identifying individuals or groups who are not on track to meet age related expectations

Some children, such as those with special educational needs, may be working from pre-key stage, or a different year group's end of year expectations. Interventions are put in place for those children who require additional support.



For those children who meet the end of year expectations, the teachers will provide a range of learning opportunities that offer greater depth and breadth of understanding specific to their year group. Assessing children using FLiC



FLiC is customisable and these are the colours that Holbrook have chosen to use:

- Developing (YELLOW) those who are working towards an objective
- Secure (GREEN) those who have mastered an objective
- Deep (BLUE) those who have deepened or embedded an objective
- Not met (PINK) those children that have not met an objective yet that has been taught
- Personal (PURPLE) those SEN children who will not be working on their year group objectives

Reporting to Parents

- Parents will receive a FLiC report at the end of each academic year.
- This will outline where their child is for each objective for all subjects in the National Curriculum.
- This information will also be passed on to the next class teacher, to inform them of where each individual child is.
