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Autumn term theme

Let's Grow



English - we will be reading and writing traditional tales, starting with *The Enormous Turnip* and then will move onto writing instructions and looking at poetry.

Maths – focusing on place value and addition and subtraction to 20.

Science - will focus on the seasons, plants and animals

History - we will be looking at the lives and achievements of Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole.

Geography - we will focus on weather and climate in the UK.

Computing – we will be exploring the computing suite, learning how to use a mouse and a keyboard and learning how to group data.

Art – we will be exploring printing, looking at the artist Orla Kiely and then 3D sculpture.

RE – we are continuing to learn about Christianity ending with learning about Palm Sunday.

DT – we will be planning and making healthy fruit snacks.

Reading books

Your child will be bringing home a phonics reader, as well as a picture book from our Y1 library to share at home. Please can phonic reader books and the Reading Diaries be in school every day please. We will have a box for books you wish to change and every child should change their books at least once a week.

Home learning

We suggest that you spend at least 15 minutes on the things that will support your child's learning the most, in addition to regular reading.
