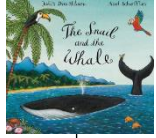


Summer Term in Year 1

Summer term theme

'What a wonderful World'



English - Our English work will focus on the book 'Katie in London', which we will then use as a basis for writing information texts.

Maths – Focusing on multiplication, division and fractions.

Science - Our Science work will consist of looking at plants and animals.

History - In History, we will be looking at how seaside holidays have changed.

Geography - We will be learning about what it is like to live by the coast.

Computing – We are practising our mouse and computer skills by creating digital paintings and writing.
