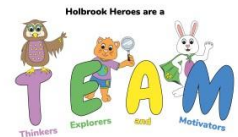

Hurting others – physically or emotionally

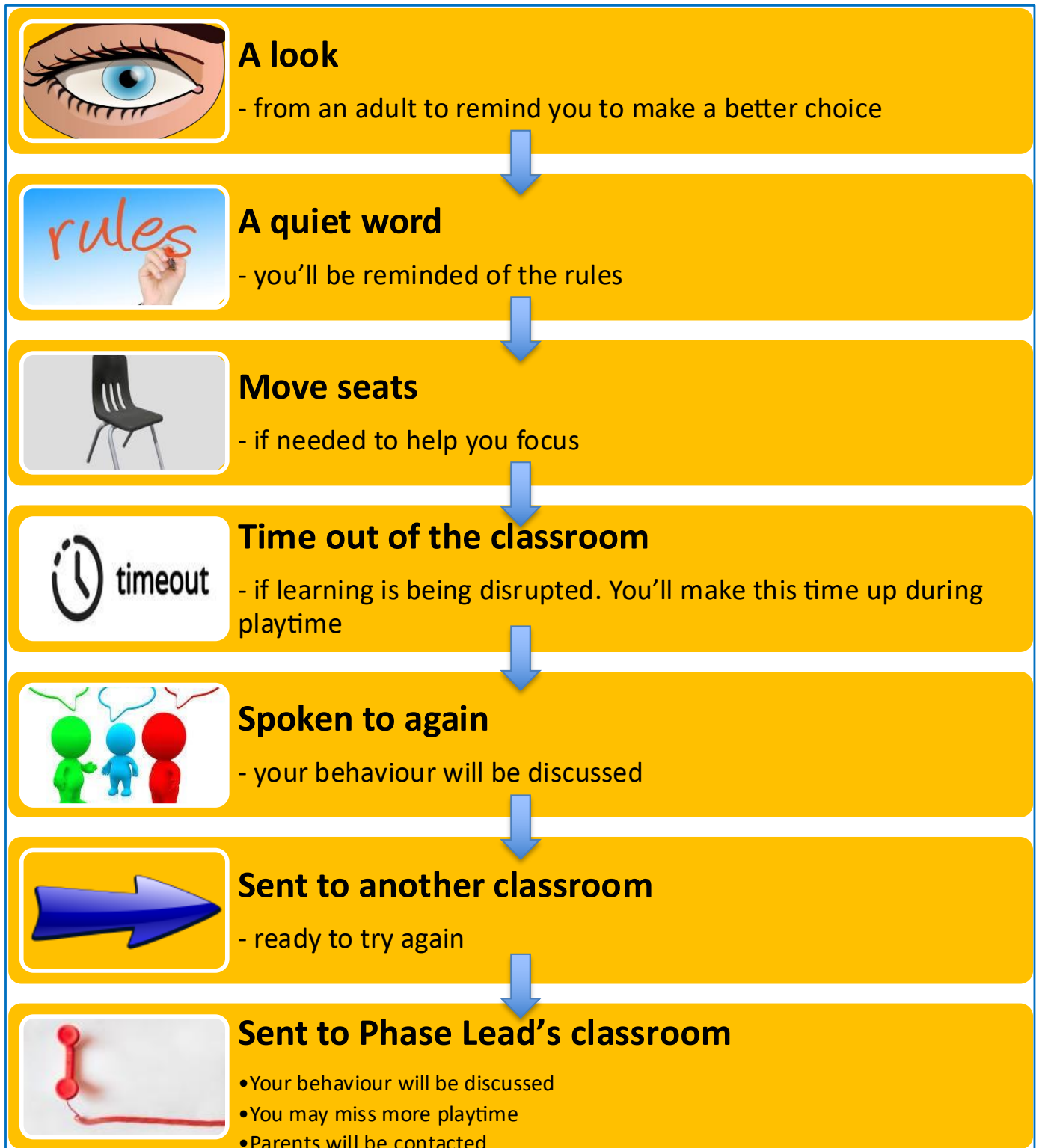


Ignoring instructions from any adult
